<u>Frome Community Bike Project</u> is a non-profit Community Interest Company that exists to support and encourage people to cycle more for everyday journeys. We do this by selling refurbished bikes; teaching bike maintenance skills; improving cycling confidence through cycle training and group bike rides; and supporting infrastructure improvements by donating our profits to Frome's Missing Links.

Purpose of the role:

We are a new organisation and have grown very quickly in the short time we've been open. - Attending team meetings as required
- Representing and promoting Frome Community Bike Project both in the workshop and in the community
